Our progress with the women in STEM project



Women make up to 28% of the workforce in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). The gender gaps are particularly high in some of the fastest-growing sectors, in view of this our STEM project continues to initiate different strategies and outreach plans around the world. We have successfully admitted over 25 women into STEM, who are currently accelerating academically, with over 8 women having a CGPA of above 3.50.

CIU WOMEN EMPOWERMENT CENTER MADE MY DREAM COME TRUE

In secondary school, I developed an interest in technology. Without prior knowledge, I would analyze and repair electric appliances and electronic gadgets at home. I was always eager to try new things in the STEM field. With each successful experimental repair, I was overjoyed. I knew then that I wanted to work in the field of technology.

My favorite secondary school subject was computer science. My success in computer science landed me a spot on the Zimbabwe National Team for the First Global Challenge, which hosts annual international robotics competitions. We were a group of three female students and two male students.

Our primary goal as a STEM team was to encourage female enrollment in male-dominated STEM studies as part of our preparation for the 2020 First Global Competition in Dubai. In a simulation environment, we worked as a team. Our task was to design a robot that would remove pollutants from rivers and the sea.

I finished my A Levels at the end of 2020 and was looking forward to beginning university. Due to financial constraints, I had to postpone my university enrollment. During that time, I studied Chinese and obtained an elementary level certificate. I kept learning programming languages.

I also got a job as an office assistant for an electronic sales company that primarily sells laptop computers and mobile phones. The job taught me some office skills and fueled my interest in STEM.

I was fortunate to receive sponsorship from the Women Empowerment Centre to study for a degree in Computer Engineering at Cyprus International University beginning in May 2022. Moving to another country brought up a range of emotions. I was excited about the possibility of studying my dream course, but I was also concerned about being away from my home and family.

In addition, by signing our heart wall, we demonstrated our support for women who had already received a diagnosis.






16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM AGAINST GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE
