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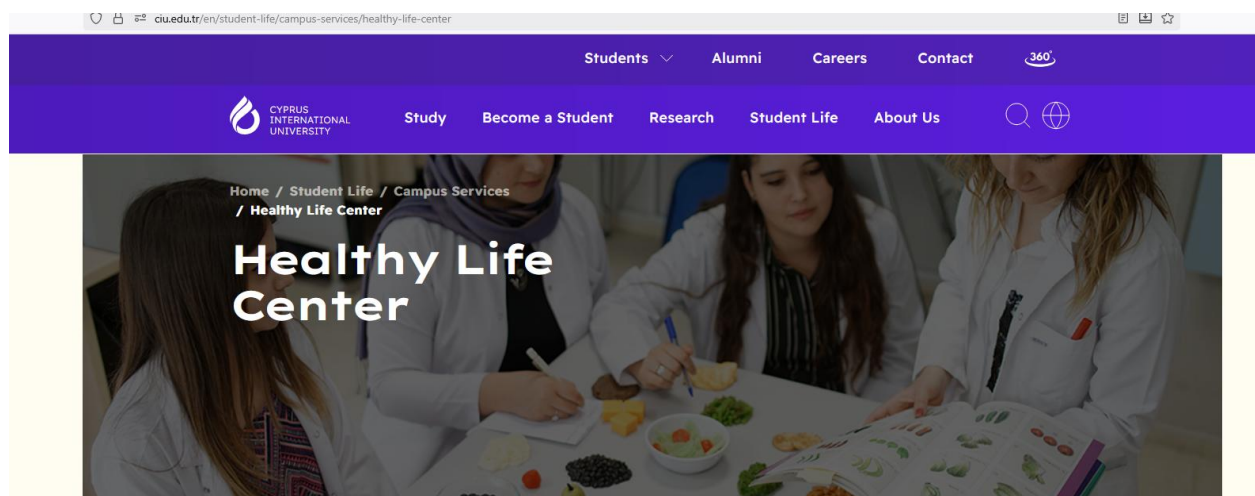
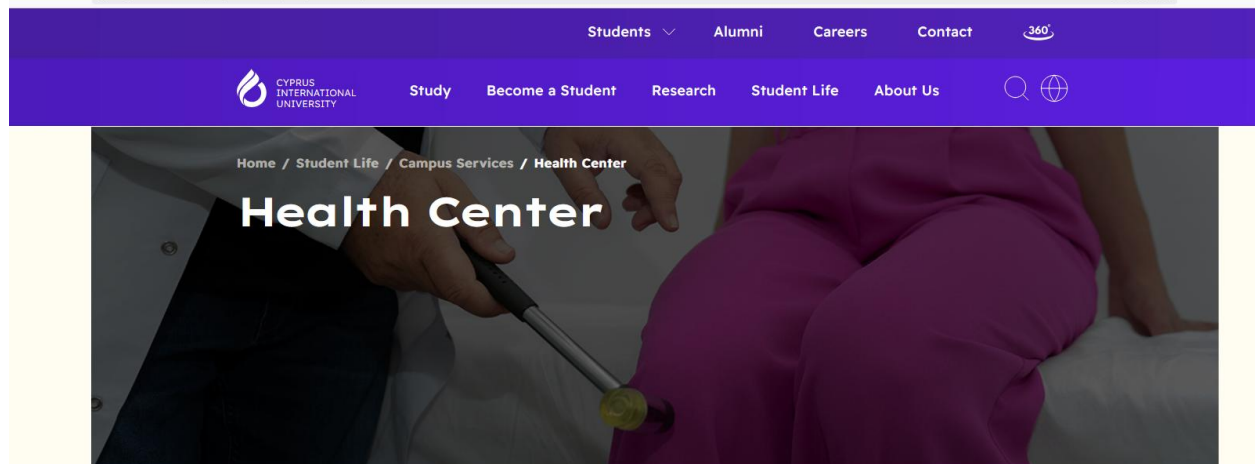

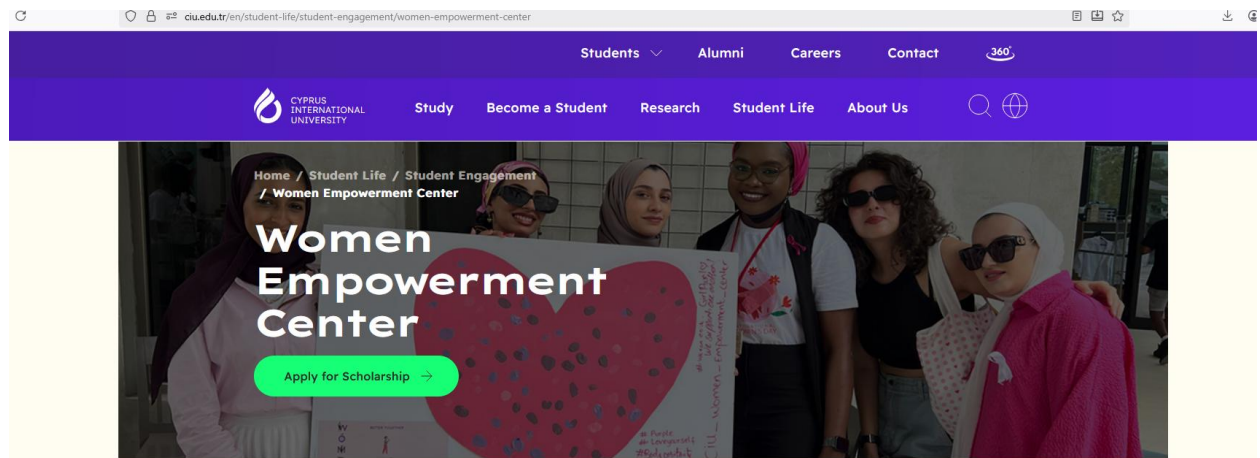
Basic Healthcare Services

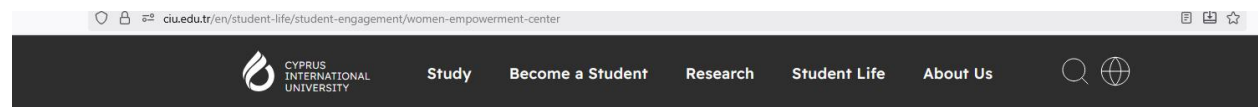

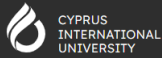

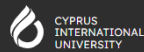

The nature of sexual behaviour: theoretical and empirical issues: definitions of normal, diversity and conformity, and implications for sexual health. The regulation of sexual conduct; Historical and social science approaches to the study of sexual behaviour (i.e. variations through time and across societies). Trends in sexual mores and their implications for public health. Influences on sexual attitudes and lifestyles - psychological, biological, cultural, religious, political, technological, etc; Political aspects of sexual health; treatment of sexual issues in society, implications of stigma, sensitivities and taboos for practice of sexual health medicine and provision of services. Communication about sexual matters. Gender issues in sexual health; Researching sexual behaviour: pitfalls and possibilities; appropriate and inappropriate methodologies; examples of qualitative and quantitative research; Public health priorities in sexual health. Designing, executing and assessing sexual health interventions.

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INTRODUCTION TO HUMAN SEXUALITY

In this course, students will learn about how research on human sexuality is conducted and become familiar with some of the key historical figures in the field. Students will learn about sexual anatomy, the stages of the human sexual response cycle, what enhances and inhibits each of these stages from both a psychological (e.g. relationships, mood, past experiences) and physiological (e.g. hormones, neurology) perspective. Different sexual problems, clinically diagnosable, and their treatment will also be examined. The goal of this class is to provide students with a broad overview of how humans function sexually. In addition, topics such as pregnancy, contraception, sexually transmitted diseases, and sexual orientation will also be covered.

GENDER, SEXUALITY AND LAW

Gender, Sexuality and Law offers an introduction to issues of gender and sexuality within the context of law. The first part of the course engages with key concepts of gender inequality and patriarchy probing the position of women in contemporary society and examining existing patriarchal manifestations. The course, then, focuses on key concepts in feminist and queer legal theory, such as heteronormativity. The second part of the course focuses upon contemporary issues of same-sex marriage, transgender rights, and diverse family formations. The course concludes with a case-studies of further key issues including medical issues of abortion and contraception, issues of violence against women, and legal regulation of pornography and prostitution.

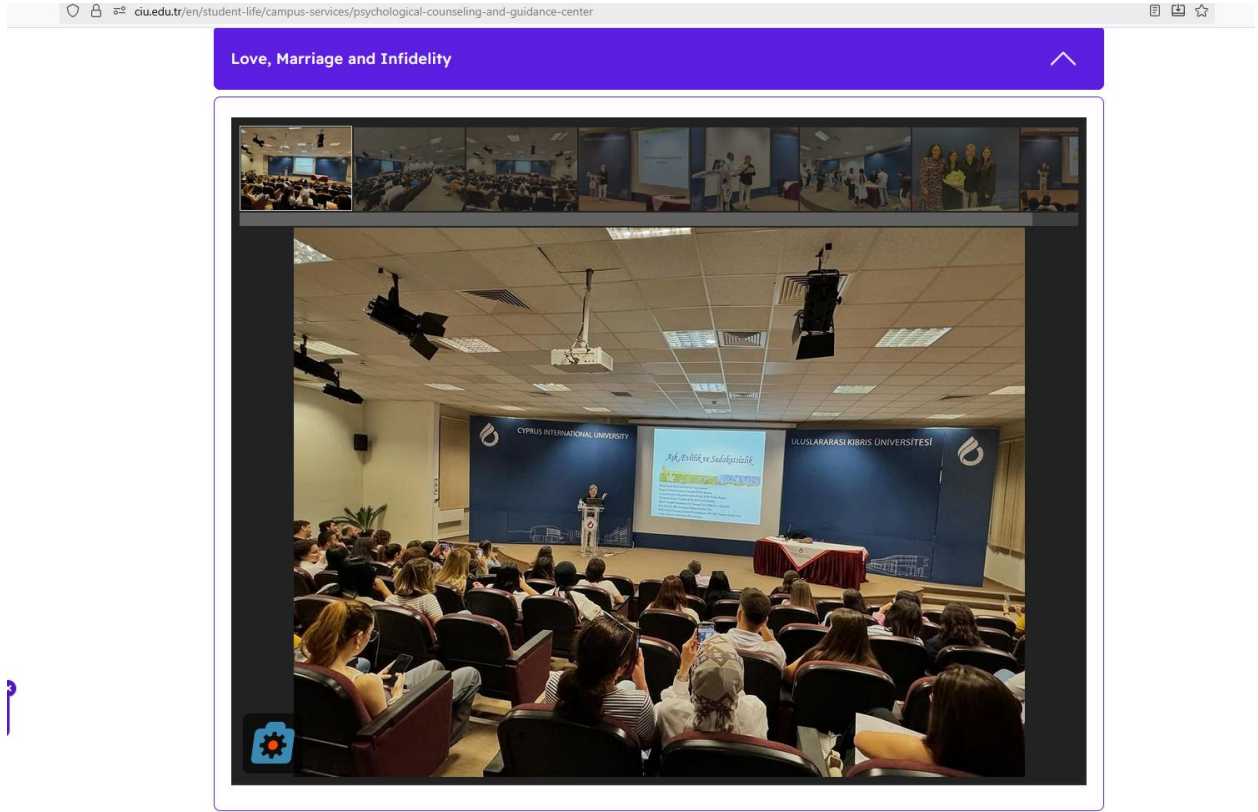
